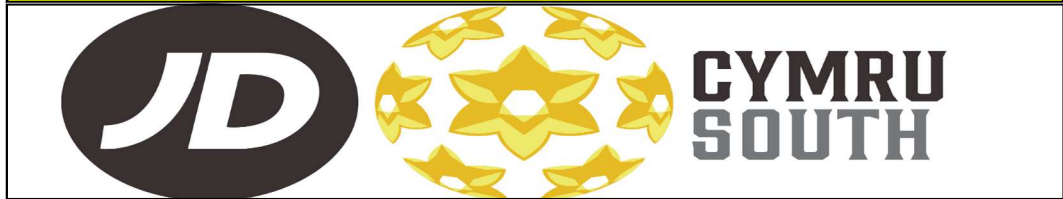

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Celtic and Ammanford have met 21 times in league and cups, the first 6 during the Mickey Copeman era in Welsh League Division 2. In 2007/8 we won 1-0 at home, Shane Williamson scoring but we went down away 0-2. In 2008/9 goals by Williamson and Sayed secured a 2-0 win at Celtic Park but we were well beaten 1-4 away, Williamson again scoring. In our promotion season, 2009/10, we lost away 1-2 in a game in which Celtic's goalscorer Scott Lanyon was red carded after the final whistle for allegedly head butting the referee. He was subsequently banned for 18 months, reduced on appeal to 4 months, and when Celtic filed arbitration papers, the FAW, the club and the player agreed a settlement. Celtic won the return at Celtic Park 4-0, the scorers Luke Sallis, Kesh Patel, Sean Matthews and Lloyd Davies.

In 2013/14 both teams finished 4th from bottom in their respective divisions, Celtic in the 1st division, Ammanford in Division 2, which under the existing rules should have meant they retained their status but both were relegated to allow Afan Lido to drop down from the Welsh Premier League. Celtic appealed and eventually lost in farcical jurisdictional circumstances in arbitration. Justice was done as in the following season, 2014/15, Ammanford came straight back up to Division 2, and in 2015/16 Celtic were promoted back to Division 1.

In Celtic's promotion season 2015/16 we won at home 3-0 through goals by Bull, Dominic Connor and Ham. The away game was played in atrocious conditions on a rain-soaked pitch in a barn-storming game. Celtic won 4-3, the goals from Bull 2, Andrew Larcombe and Connor in Celtic's 10th successive Welsh League away win. In 2016/17 Celtic won 3-0 at Ammanford in the 1st round of the League Cup, the scorers Rhys Williams, Bull and Lee Penry. After steadying the ship in 2016/17 the West Walians young manager Gruf Harrison guided his team to promotion to the top tier the following season after an absence of 16 years.

In 2018/19 5-3 Celtic won 5-3 at home, Celtic's goal scorers Josh Bull, Chris Ham, Owen Cook, Louis Feeley and an own goal. The teams met again at Celtic Park in the Welsh Cup round 1, Celtic coming out on top 3-0 through goals by Ham, Bull and Isaac Powell, who, at age 17 became Celtic's first scorer born in the Millennium. Ammanford took revenge in the away fixture, smashing Celtic 5-0.

In the covid curtailed season 2019-20 the teams met once, at Ammanford, and again the hosts went on the rampage winning 5-2. Celtic's scorers Zac Osborne and Leo Ross. In 2021-22, at Ammanford, the home side were 2-1 ahead mid-way through the 2nd half but Celtic made a superb comeback, clinching a 3-2 win with goals from Tyler Broom, Tom Meechan and Jordan Meaney. Celtic won the tightly fought return 1-0 at Celtic Park to complete a league double, Alex Bonthron scoring on his first Celtic start.

In 2022/23 Celtic beat Ammanford 1-0 in the 1st round of the Welsh Cup at Celtic Park thanks to a Dominic Connor goal. This was Celtic's 8th successive win at home against the Swansea valley side. In the league away at Ammanford the hosts won 3-2, Lewis Iles scoring Celtic's 2 goals. The return at Celtic Park was a 1-1 draw, Josh Rippon scoring Celtic's goal. Last season Ammanford won at home 4-3, Bonthron 2 and Iles scoring for Celtic. The return at Celtic Park was a 2-1 win for Celtic, Meechan and Harrison Lewis scoring.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwiweiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. Last season Celtic finished a creditable 8th in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 1 - 3 TREFELIN BGC (10-Aug)

On a humid day, Cwmbran Celtic hosted Trefelin BGC at the Avondale Motor Park Arena. The visitors arrived with their star man Ex Swansea City hero Lee Trundle playing upfront at the ripe age of 47. The game was delayed by fifteen minutes due to the referee arriving at the ground late. It may have been a good thing though as the weather improved and the rain held off as the game approached kick off.

Cwmbran came into the game on a dreadful run of form having lost all three games so far this season and having conceded three goals in all those previous games.

Trefelin entered the game in mixed form having won just one of their two games in the league and having been knocked out of the MG cup in the first round by Caerau Ely.

The tempo for the game was set very early on as immediately the game was very stop-start with a number of soft fouls being given in the early minutes. The game was quite even in opening stages but that soon changed when a Trefelin striker raced onto a lobbed pass over the defence but was taken out by an out rushing keeper Iwan Hooper, who rightly gave away a penalty and received a yellow card. Roan Piper stepped up and calmly converted the spot kick to give Trefelin an early one-nil lead after just eight minutes.

That goal gave the visitors a confidence boost and that man again Roan Piper cut down the left hand side & shot at goal but Hooper saved with his legs and put the ball out for a corner.

On the fifteenth minute mark another Trefelin attack down the left hand side saw their left winger brought down in the box slight dubiously in this reporters opinion, but another penalty was awarded to the visitors and with a sense of deja vu Piper again stepped up and scored this penalty just to the left of centre just as he had for the first penalty to give Trefelin a two-nil lead after just fifteen minutes to silence the home fans who feared that yet again Celtic would concede three goals in a game.

Trefelin felt comfortable with the two-nil lead and began showing their class as they kept the ball and passed it around nicely whereas the home side looked like they had only just met and struggled to string more than two or three passes together, but the home sides flow wasn't helped by the fact that seemingly every time a Trefelin player went down the referee gave a foul.

However after twenty minutes Celtic had their best chance of the game so far when a corner from the left side fell to Jude Bull on the edge and he had a very good effort which only just went wide.

After thirty-eight minutes things went from worse to even more worse as Steffen Jenkins rose above the Cwmbran defence and fired a bullet header past Hooper to give the away side a very well deserved three-nil lead after forty-one minutes.

A minute later and attempted to score with a header of his own but it was straight at Aaron Jones in the Trefelin goal. That meant the first half ended with Trefelin a very commanding three-nil lead.

The second half began with Celtic looking fired up and playing better than they had in the first half, a free kick from halfway in the visitors half fell to Bonthron who had an effort on goal but much like most of Cwmbran's other efforts it went harmlessly to the Trefelin goalkeeper.

Five minutes into the second half and almost unbelievably the visitors were awarded a third penalty when a Trefelin striker was looking for contact and got it in the box for what I and many others in the crowd thought was a soft penalty. Luckily for Cwmbran, Piper failed to score a hat-trick of penalties as his effort hit the post and got cleared to spare the hosts going down even further.

A couple of minutes later and the home side had their first good chance of the second half when Jude Bull was on the end of a decent move and had a shot on goal from the centre of the area, but it flew just over the goal to leave Celtic frustrated as time started to run out for a comeback.

It wasn't until the last ten minutes of the match that things livened up again as Cwmbran pushed up the energy to attempt to get back into the game, the home side first had a couple of corners the second of which led to a goalmouth scramble but the home side where unable to force the ball into the net.

With five minutes remaining the home side did finally manage to get on the scoresheet when Isaac Powell's free kick from halfway in the Trefelin half found Alex Bonthron in the penalty box who rose first and headed the ball home to give this reporter hope that a miraculous four-three victory could be on the cards.

Hopes were increased more a couple minutes later when Celtic should have had a penalty for a foul on Bull I believe but the decision went the other way after the defender was looking for contact and that pretty much summed up Cwmbran Celtic's day as a frustrating performance and a difficult referee mixed with a good performance from Trefelin led to a three-one defeat for the home side.

A BRIEF HISTORY AMMANFORD

Ammanford AFC was formed in the early 20th century, plying its trade in the Ammanford and District League at Rice Road. The first recorded fixture to date was in 1908/09, when Ammanford Town played a friendly against a Rhondda touring team. In the 1920's, Ammanford Thursdays played at Caemawr, Betws, before the first Betws soccer club called Betws Blackbirds played on Rice Road with their dressing rooms and headquarters at The Coopers Hotel, Betws during the 1930's. The committee at that time had the foresight to purchase the playing field and for land to build a club house for £750. It wasn't until 1949 when Ammanford entered the Welsh Football League, then under the name of Betws. In 1957/58, we finished runners up to Llanelli, before being crowned champions of Division 2 (West) and promoted to Division 1 in 1958/59. We also won the Division 2 cup, beating Division 2 (East) champions Tredomen. On Saturday 22nd August 1959 the club played its opening First Division Welsh League fixture at home against Cardiff City Reserves and won 2 -1. At the request of the Welsh Football League, we changed our name to Ammanford Town in 1960. It didn't take long to stamp our authority on the Welsh League circuit, employing former Liverpool player Roy Saunders to take over the helm in the early 1960's. This was followed with the clubhouse being built at Rice Road in 1963. In 1964, at a cost of £4,000, a 450 seater stand and new changing rooms were built at Rice Road. From 1966/67 to 67/68 we finished Runners-up to Cardiff City Reserves in consecutive seasons. Our main cup achievement came in 1983/84, where we reached the Final of Welsh Football League Cup, losing to Lake United in the final. In 1992, we amalgamated with Ammanford Athletic to become Ammanford AFC. Unfortunately, in April 2003, a fire destroyed the stand and changing rooms at Rice Road, the start of the demise of the Rice Road ground. Therefore, in 2006 we moved to our new ground 'The Rec'. Dimensions of the new pitch were 101 x 63 metres. Despite being relegated in 2013/14 due to a Welsh Pyramid restructure, we went on a 15 match win streak to gain promotion back to Welsh League Division Two in 2014/15. We remained in this division for three years before gaining promotion to Welsh League Division One for the 2018/19 season. The club reached the fourth round of the Welsh Cup in 1991 and made it to the quarter-finals in February 1999.
