WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Today we welcome Taffs Well to Celtic Park in the 1st round of the WBS League Cup. The teams first met in Celtic's 1st season in Welsh League Division 1 following their promotion in 2010. The game, on 8 January 2011, ended 7 weeks inactivity for Celtic, having not played since 20 November 2010. Celtic, managed by Ben Graham, were on a 10 match run of just one win and 9 defeats. However the lay-off affected Taffs Well more because Celtic won 6-0 with goals from Shane Williamson 2, Luke Sallis 2, Lloyd Davies and Chris Pearce. Alas the win only proved to be a brief respite as Celtic then went a further 6 games without a win and Taffs Well easily won the return 3-0. Despite this horrendous mid-season spell, Celtic rallied in the run-in to retain their 1st Division status.

In 2011/12, Celtic, managed by Taffs Well old boy Gareth Morgan, were well beaten 3-0 home and away. Gareth was sent off in the away game. There was another double for Taffs in 2012/13, 2-0 at Celtic Park and 2-1 at Taffs. Lee Challenger scored for Celtic from the penalty spot. 2013-14 brought Taffs their 5th successive win in this fixture, 1-0 at Rhiw Dd'ar, but Celtic broke the run in the return with a 2-1 win in a red-blooded encounter. Taffs skipper Lee Williams and manager Lee Bridgman were both sent off. Despite this, the 10-men visitors took the lead through Marcus Jones. Challenger equalised and Celtic won in the 93rd minute when an error from the keeper resulted in an own goal off a desperate lunge to clear the ball by a defender. At the end of the season Celtic were relegated as the 4th from bottom team to make way for demoted Welsh Premier side Afan Lido.

In 2016/17, with Celtic back in the top tier, Taffs were rocked at Celtic Park by the first half sending off of central defender Cortez Belle, and they were then swamped by a superb attacking spell which put the home side 4-0 up at half time. Chris Ham scored 2, the second a sensational goal after a typical mazy run from midfield. Josh Bull and Owen Cook were the other scorers and the game ended 4-0 to put Celtic top of the league. Celtic's final game of the season at Rhiw Dd'ar saw them go down 1-0 despite having much of the game.

In 2017/18 Celtic won 1-0 at home, Rhys Williams scoring against his old club, but the away game was the same old story – a 3-0 defeat on one of our bogey grounds. In 2018/19 Celtic ended a sequence of 6 successive away defeats against the Wellmen with a fine 3-0 win with goals by Bull, Ham and Callum Wakeham. In the return at Celtic Park a 2-1 win completed the double, Bull scoring both goals. In 2019/20, in the Cymru League, Celtic won 2-0 at Celtic Park, the goals by Jordan Clarke and Niall Yeates. The return was not played because the season was ended early by the covid outbreak.

In 2021/22 the teams drew 3-3 at Taffs Well. Lewis Iles 2 (including a penalty) and Tom Meechan looked to have gained the 3 points for Celtic but the hosts equalised in the last minute of time added on. In the return, Taffs were easy winners 3-0. In 2022/23 Taffs won 4-3 at Celtic Park, Lewis Iles (2) and Taylor Davies scored for Celtic. Celtic ran riot in the return winning 5-1 with goals by Lewis Iles (4) and Isaac Powell. Lewis certainly likes playing the Wellmen – 8 goals in the past 2 seasons.

Last season in the 1st round of the MG Cup, the Wellmen were cruising to victory 2-0 ahead into time added on but goals from Gabriel Howells and Andrew Hewitt forced a penalty shootout which Taffs won 3-0. In the league, the teams drew 1-1 at Celtic Park, Hinwood scoring for Celtic. In the return the Wellmen gave Celtic a thrashing 6-2. Alex Bonthron (penalty) and Meechan scored for Celtic. Earlier this month in the league Taffs won 2-1 at Rhiw Dd'ar. Bonthron gave Celtic the lead but the hosts came back to clinch a 2-1 victory with a 95th minute goal.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwiweiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In the past two seasons Celtic have finished creditable 8th and 9th place in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 4 - 0 AMMANFORD (26-Aug)

CWMBRAN HIT FOUR PAST AMMANFORD

On a beautiful sunny bank holiday Monday in late August Cwmbrian Celtic hosted Ammanford at the Avondale Motor Park Arena, in a game between two teams who both had only one victory from their first five games of the season. Simon Berry made a whopping six changes to his starting lineup from the 2-1 last minute defeat to Taffs Well on Friday evening.

The game began with both teams looking full of energy as they both looked to break the deadlock early but strokes of luck for both defenses plus some good saves kept the game 0-0 after the first half hour but then the first major incident came as Ammanford after surviving a period of Cwmbrian pressure played the ball nicely out of defense and they had three attackers running at a solitary Celtic defender and unluckily for the visitors Tristan Jenkins picked up an Injury which looked like a pulled hamstring as he looked certain to score as he approached the penalty box.

Nine minutes later and Cwmbrian made the most of that extraordinary piece of luck when a Thomas Meechan corner found Cole Doolan's head at the near post and the ball went into the back of the net to give the hosts a one-nil lead in the thirty-ninth minute.

Celtic seemed to be heading for a lead going into halftime but needed one more stroke of luck as another Ammanford attack led to a shot on goal which had the defence beaten but absolutely walloped the crossbar and went out of play to ensure the hosts did indeed go into the break with a one-nil lead but it could very easily have been the other way around for the visitors.

The second half began with Ammanford attempting to equalise early on but after a few half chances the game slowed down and became a bit more scrappy with both sides picking up a yellow card a piece in the first ten minutes of the second half Meaney collecting one for Cwmbrian and Morgan Clarke being given a booking for Ammanford.

Just before the hour mark Celtic managed to double their lead when Mario Van Dieren played a glorious cross ball from the right flank which found Dom Connor who had outsprinted his marker down the left wing. Dom turned inside the floundering defender and, reminiscent of Yusuf Dikec from the Olympics, he rifled the ball with his right foot bang on target into the top right corner of the net for what is an early contender for goal of the season in this reporters mind.

That second goal gave Celtic a lot more confidence and they started dominating the play and looked more likely to score next. Now I'm going to be honest here as after seventy two minutes of play Cwmbrian did just that, but they scored so many goals during the game and I'm writing this report twenty four hours after the game so all the goals have melted into one in my mind So I don't actually recall what happened but what I do know is that Thomas Meechan tripled Celtic's lead after seventy two minutes of play.

In the eighty seventh minute Thomas Meechan scored his second of the game and this was one that was unforgettable and will live long in the memory of everyone in the crowd as Meechan took a corner from the left hand side and his in swinging corner went over everybody and straight into the back of the net which I believe surprised Meechan as anybody else in the ground. That made the score four (FOUR) nil to Cwmbrian Celtic.

For the most part that was the end of the drama for the game apart from Jordan Meaney being sent off after getting a second yellow card for a foul just outside the Cwmbrian penalty area. The resultant free kick came to nothing to ensure the game did indeed finish four-nil to Cwmbrian Celtic.

A BRIEF HISTORY TAFFS WELL

Following the end of World War II, Elan Gough and Bill Newman initiated the idea of merging local clubs to improve the facilities and playing standards than experienced pre-war. This idea was warmly welcomed and Taffs Well AFC was born. The Club was a key member of the South Wales Amateur League.

After a successful initial period, Bill Newman passed away and the Club faced a difficult time. In 1960, Don James joined the Club as Secretary. The determination of Don and many others resulted in a change of fortunes for the team both on and off the pitch. Don has now been with the Club for 62 years and his fantastic efforts were rewarded in 2014 as the main stand was renamed the "Don James Stand".

Success followed and the Club won the South Wales Amateur League First Division in 1975, 1976 and 1977 as well as South Wales Intermediate Cup in 1975 and 1977. The Club entered the Welsh League in 1977. Malcolm Frazer joined the Club the same year and his hard work was recognised in 2017 with the unveiling of a new stand brandishing his name. In 1996 Norma Samuel became the Club's Secretary having previously been a committee member and has been another tremendous servant ever since.

Under the management of our now Chairman, Lee Bridgeman, the Clubs' most successful spell in recent times saw the Club finish Division One runners up in 2011-12 and 2012-13 and winning the Nathaniel MG Cup four times in five seasons; 2011-12, 2012-13, 2014-2015 and 2015-16. In 2018-19 Taffs Well Youth side won the Welsh League Youth Division and in 2021-22 our development team won the South Wales and National Development Championships.

The revised JD Cymru South began in 2019 and we have remained in the league since. In 2023 the club created out first women's team and all teams will be looking to progress this year.

Our club is run by a loyal band of volunteers. It really could not exist without the support and commitment of individuals such as Don, Malcolm, Steve Samuels, the wider committee and those unsung heroes who turn up to undertake those small tasks that can make the biggest difference.
