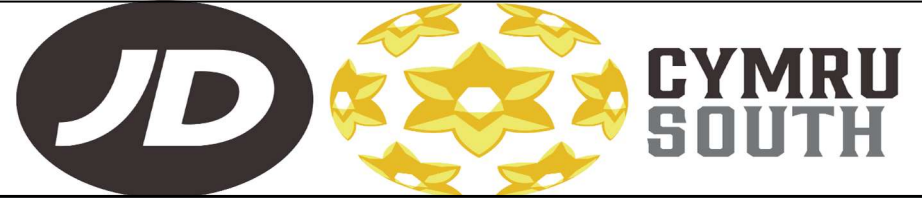

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Today's visitors Goytre United are the longest serving current Tier 2 side having been in the Welsh League Division 1 and Cymru South since 1996/7. In 5 seasons between 2005 and 2010 they enjoyed a golden spell in which they were the Welsh League champions 3 times and runners-up twice.

Celtic have played Goytre United 19 times, all in FAW tier 2. In 2010/11 Goytre did the double, 1-0 at Celtic Park, and 3-1 at Glenhafod Park, Chris Pearce scoring Celtic's goal. In 2011/12 the sides drew 2-2 at Celtic Park. Shane Williamson and Craig Cheedy put Celtic 2 up but the visitors pulled 2 goals back to force the draw. In the away fixture Celtic won 2-1 through goals by Luke Sallis and Nanah Bah to take manager Gareth Morgan's side into 2nd place in the league table.

In 2012/13 Celtic disappointingly lost at Glenhafod Park. Owen Llewellyn gave Celtic the lead, but 2 late goals earned the hosts their first league win since 28th September and their first home league win of the season. Goytre completed the double with a 2-0 win in the return at Celtic Park. In 2013/14 Goytre again did the double winning 2-1 at home, Josh Bull scoring for Celtic, and 3-0 at Celtic Park. Celtic were relegated at the end of that season despite finishing 4th from bottom.

In 2016/17 Celtic were back in the 1st Division. A Josh Bull penalty secured a 1-1 draw at Celtic Park and Celtic won the away fixture 2-0, the goals from Lloyd Kinsella and Josh Bull. In 2018/9 Goytre won 1-0 at Celtic Park but in the return game Celtic gave one of their best performances of the season with an emphatic 4-1 win, the goals from Andrew Larcombe, Tom Haggett, Owen Cook and an own goal.

In 2019/20 in the opening game of the season the sides drew 0-0 at Glenhafod Park. The return at Celtic Park in April saw Owen Cook in temporary charge following the departure of Lee Challenger and Nanah Bah after a run of 7 games (including 5 at home) with only 1 point. Celtic won 4-0 through goals by Louis Feeley, Josh Bull, Chris Ham and Callum Wakeham. This was Celtic's first win against Goytre in 7 games. In 2019/20 Celtic were rampant in the home fixture, again winning 4-0, all the goals in the 2nd half through Jordan Clarke, Louis Feeley, Zac Osborne and Andrew Larcombe. The return was cancelled because of the covid outbreak.

In 2021-22 Goytre won 4-0 at Glenhafod Park but Celtic won the return 1-0 thanks to a goal from Andrew Hewitt. Last season Celtic won 3-1 at Glenhafod Park, Alex Bonthron scoring 2 including a penalty, and Lewis Iles scored the 3rd with a superb 35-yard lob. Celtic won the return also by 3-1 in-James Kinsella's last match. Alex Bonthron started needing 2 goals to be Cymru South top scorer. The teams were level 1-1 late on, Lewis Iles scoring for Celtic. On 87 minutes Alex put Celtic ahead and then, sensationally, in the 8th minute of time added on, he scored his 30th goal which secured him the Golden Boot.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwiweiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In the past two seasons Celtic have finished creditable 8th and 9th place in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 2 - 3 TAFFS WELL (31-Aug)

Celtic started this game brightly but were stopped in their tracks after 15 minutes when young goalkeeper, Jamie Pring, who was making his 1st team debut, was sent off for bringing a player down just outside the box. It seemed a very harsh decision and it looked like a yellow card should have sufficed. Iwan Hooper was then brought on to play in goal with the unlucky Cole Doolan making way.

The price was paid in the 29th minute when Taffs' Finley Haymen found himself unmarked in the centre of goal and easily side-footed home. Celtic's 10 men were not going to lie down, however, and two minutes later Alex Bonthron scored a similar goal at the other end, converting a cross from Isaac Powell. They continued to have more of the game than their opponents and deservedly took the lead just before the break when Alex played in Tom Meechan, who held off a defender and placed his low shot in the far corner of the net.

HALF TIME: Celtic 2 Taffs Well 1

Taffs came out in the second half and started to play the ball around more with the obvious intent of making Celtic's 10 men work harder to stay in the game. The tactic paid off Drew Cagle equalised for the visitors in the 53rd minute.

In spite of working hard to stay in the game the one man deficit was starting to tell on Celtic and was no real surprise when Cagle popped up again just after the hour mark to put Taffs in the lead.

Celtic continued to strive to somehow find an equaliser but understandably, they were beginning to tire and were finding it difficult to manufacture any real goal-scoring opportunities.

To compound their situation when Alex Bonthron was sent off in added time for a second yellow card. Again, it looked a very harsh decision as Alex had quite clearly been dragged to the ground by a defender. The referee decided not to penalise this and when Alex complained to him, he immediately brandished a yellow card, followed quickly by a red one.

This defeat was hard to take as the lads had battled well with 10 men to try to get a result.

CELTIC SNATCH DEFEAT FROM THE JAWS OF VICTORY!

We travelled to Baglan with a bit of a depleted side. Centre Back, Callum Hodges, was still not fit to return. His partner at the back, Jordan Meaney, was suspended and midfielder, Mario van Dieren was unavailable. Club skipper, Andrew Larcombe, was still not fit enough to start the game but was included on the bench.

The lads started a bit tentatively allowing Baglan to take control of the early stages and they took advantage of this when Tom Davies latched on to a long ball from 'keeper Mathew Stanton and easily fired past Iwan Hooper. We gradually got a foothold in the game and equalised when the ball fell kindly to Kian Bodenham in the box, following a free kick from Isaac Powell, and he hammered it into the roof of the net. We then took control of the game and took the lead after 42 minutes.

Tom Meachen did well on the left to find space to hit a low ball across goal where Alex Bonthron latched on to it and struck a firm left foot shot past Stanton. Celtic then comfortably played out the rest of the half to go in with a goal advantage.

We couldn't have started the second period better as, within a couple of minutes, Jordan Clarke rose brilliantly at the far post to head home a cross from the left to put us 3-1 up.

At this stage of the game, we looked in total control so what happened after that was the stuff of nightmares! Helped by what can only (politely!) be described as some inept defending, Baglan dragged themselves back into the game with two goals in the space of 5 minutes from Tom Davies and Lewis Holmes to bring the scores level.

Worse was to follow ten minutes later when Jordan Evans evaded a couple of half-hearted tackles on the edge of the penalty area to break through and glide the ball past the advancing Hooper into the corner of the net. The lads looked thoroughly dejected, but our defenders had only themselves to blame for what had happened.

To be fair to the team, they did raise their game in the last ten minutes and came close to finding an equalising goal on a couple of occasions. However, it was not to be and we ended up losing all three points in a game we could and should have won.

A BRIEF HISTORY GOYTRE UNITED

In the spring of 1963 what funds the club had were handed to football secretary Boris Suhanski. Utilising these funds Goytre United Football Club was reborn. The club were members of the Port Talbot and District Football League but were promoted to the South Wales Amateur League in the late sixties. After a successful opening spell things became more difficult and the club was eventually relegated back into the Port Talbot League in the late seventies.

In 1982 the Goytre United AFC Social Club opened.

A period of ten years passed when the club competed in the Port Talbot and District League. During this time the club grew in stature on and off the field and in 1988 was re-elected back into the South Wales Amateur League. In the 1989–90 season the club secured promotion to the First Division of the South Wales Amateur League. Also in this year a 350 all-seating grandstand was built.

In the 1990–91 season the club were promoted to the Welsh Football League and on 24 August 1991 played their first match against Milford United. Since the club's elevation into the Welsh League, steady improvements have been made both on and off the pitch and in 2000 floodlights were erected. In the 2003–2004 season the club attained its highest position within the League when it ended the season in the runners-up spot in division one and just missed out on promotion to the Welsh Premier League.

In the 2004–05 season the club won the League Challenge Cup for the first time at Ton Pentre. Further history was made in the 2005–06 season when the club lifted the Welsh League First Division Championship, only losing three games. However, they chose to remain in the Welsh League First Division for the 2006–07 season. [1] Normally, the top clubs from each of the two feeder leagues (the Welsh League First Division and the Cymru Alliance) are promoted subject to an application for membership of the Welsh Premier League being received and accepted and the stadium and infrastructure safety criteria of the League being met. Goytre United elected not to apply for promotion, and the First Division runners-up, Neath Athletic, failed to meet the stadium criteria and had their bid for promotion rejected.

In the 2006–07 season, the reserve team won the Welsh League Reserve West Division for the first time in the club's history, guided by former team player/manager Paul Wiseman.

In 2007–08 they won the Welsh Football League again, but once more they declined to apply for promotion to the Welsh Premier League.

In 2008-09 the same situation occurred with Goytre winning the Welsh Football League for a third time, but were still denied promotion.


















In the 2022/23 Season in the Cymru South Goytre started off the season with Mark Pike as the manager. Goytre got off to a bad start with the first game of the season which was in the Nathaniel MG Cup taking a hefty defeat to Trefelin which ended 6-1 with Youngster Alex Walters scoring the only goal. Things were looking promising after taking 4 points from out first 2 games against Swansea University and Cambrian and Clydach Vale. The season took a turn for the worst after picking up 4 points out of a possible 30 in the next 10 games which had us sitting in the relegation zone with the possibility of relegation for the first time in 20+ years. At the start of December the clubs chairman Lyndon made the hard decision of parting ways with the current coaching team to bring in the previous seasons winning manager Karl Lewis and his team of coaches. Karl got off to a great start by beating his old club Llantwit Major 4-3 who were sitting in the top half of the table. From the 18 remaining games Karl had to rescue Goytre from the relegation zone he managed to take 24 points and secured Goytres place in the Cymru South for the 2023/24 season. A fantastic job done by Karl and the team who now focus on bringing Goytre back to where they belong. Also big credit to Lyndon and all involved who acted fast with the best interest of the club in mind.
