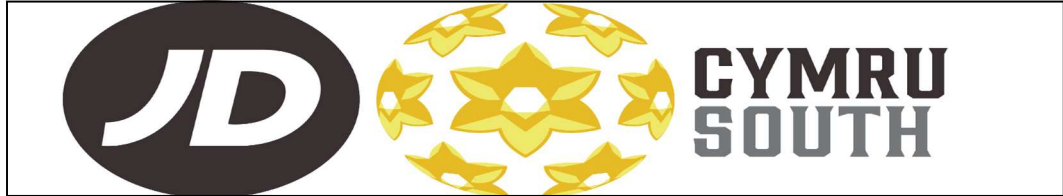

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Today's visitors Trethomas Bluebirds are presently riding high at the top of the Cymru South league table. At the turn of the century Celtic and the Bluebirds were both in the Gwent t County League. In 2004/5 when Celtic finished 2nd in the first division to gain promotion into the Welsh League, the Bluebirds were languishing in division 3 having finished 8th. They eventually gained entry into the Welsh League in 2015/16 after winning the Gwent first division title that season.

The teams met for the first time in the Welsh/Cymru league era in the opening game of this season in the 1st round of the MG Nathaniel Cup. The Bluebirds were making their debut in this competition having been promoted to the Cymru South as last season's champions from the Ardal South-East League and they ran out 3-2 winners. Celtic were 2-1 up at half time in that game with goals by Alex Bonthron and Tom Meechan in response to Levi Ree's 8th minute opener. However, Trethomas clinched the win through goals by Leon Thomas and William Bevan.

Celtic go into today's game having picked up just 3 points from one win in their last 6 league games. Only Goytre United (2 points from their last 6) have a worse record.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwiweiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In the past two seasons Celtic have finished creditable 8th and 9th place in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 0 - 1 LLANELLI TOWN (02-Nov)

Cwmburan Celtic put up a stubborn rearguard display against title chasers Llanelli Town at Cwmburan Park and, although they were under the cosh for most of the game, they were only beaten by a penalty goal resulting from a very harsh decision in the 37th minute that Louis Cochrane pushed an opponent in the penalty box, Henry Jones converting from the spot. Incidentally, this was Louis's debut for the 1st team having made 70 appearances for the Reserves.

Llanelli have only lost once in the league this season and are unbeaten away. They deserved their 4th successive win, not least because Cymru C international striker Ethan Cann was a constant threat. He could have had a hat-trick. In the 1st half he shot an overhead kick over the bar and brought a save from Hooper. In the 2nd half he shot just wide. Celtic rarely threatened the Llanelli goal, their best effort coming from Mario van Dieren who shot wide with a fine 35-yard effort in the 1st half.

MATCH REPORT: AFAN LIDO 4 - 1 CWMBRAN CELTIC (08-Nov)

Celtic travelled to Aberavon for a Friday night game under the Afan Lido floodlights in the knowledge that a win against a team who had won just one of their last 13 league games would put Celtic 7 points ahead of bottom placed Lido. However, Lido reduced the gap to 1 point, with a convincing 4-1 win in which all their goals were a consequence of poor defending by Celtic who sank to their 4th successive league defeat.

Lido took the lead in the 14th minute when the Celtic defence failed to clear their lines from a cross from the right by Travis James and allowed veteran midfield captain Liam McCreesh to nip in and score from close range. Two good saves from Celtic keeper Iwan Hooper kept the score to 1-0 at half time. In the 53rd minute Celtic were level when a free kick taken by Hooper pierced the Lido central defence for Tom Meechan to race down the middle and slip the ball under the body of keeper Ben Haines into the net. However, the lead was short-lived when, on 59 minutes, a cross from the left was headed away but straight to the unmarked Ben Keen who gleefully slammed the ball into the net. Celtic rarely threatened the Lido goal thereafter apart from a long range shot over the bar. In the 65th minute Lido went 3-1 up when Liam Thomas intercepted a back pass, sent the isolated Hooper the wrong way and placed the ball into the empty net. Meechan had a shot pushed round the post by Haines for a corner but on 90+2 minutes substitute Damon Thomas arrived unmarked in the 6-yard box to head the ball into the net from fellow substitute Babucar Sauane's corner to complete Celtic's misery.

This was Celtic's 5th successive defeat at Afan Lido. In 9 away league games stretching back to 2010/11 Celtic's record is won 0 drawn 2 lost 7. Celtic are now in the bottom 3 ahead of Taffs Well only on goal difference with Lido now just one point adrift.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF TRETTHOMAS BLUEBIRDS

Formed in 1903 as Trethomas Football Club, the pitch was bought by the miners who worked at the mines of Trethomas. According to local accounts, workers at the Bedwas Colliery purchased land in the nearby village of Trethomas – called the Llanbafon Drive Playing Field, as a field for recreation, including organised sport. Legend has it, the Llanfabon Drive Playing Field served as the home of the Trethomas Bluebirds for more than 100 years.

Taking inspiration from Cardiff City, one of our founders then dubbed the club The Trethomas Bluebirds. The club entered the Gwent County League in 2003 and won promotion to Division Two as Champions in 2005-2006. Promotion to Division One followed and the club finished as runners up in the 2012/13 season. The club was then promoted to the Welsh Football League in 2015/16 for the first time.

OUR MISSION

Our number one goal for the upcoming season is to be promoted into the Cymru South League. We believe that our recent success and exciting signings have put us in the best position possible to win the league and gain promotion.

As a club, we are on a mission to provide an inclusive and supportive football community, whilst striving for excellence both on and off the pitch. As a team, we hold ourselves to the highest standards and always represent our club's values with integrity.

Last season Wrexham were 3rd in the Women's Premier league in their first season in tier 1 and were Welsh cup runners-up so it was always going to be a tough game for Celtic who had to re-organise their defence in the absence of suspended Elena Scrivens. Skipper Eloise Meaney dropped back to central defence and Fiona Anthony dropped to midfield in place of the unavailable Jodie Challenger. This inevitably weakened Celtic's potency, missing the influential Eloise in midfield and Fiona's incisive running up front. Having gone a goal down Celtic equalised from a fabulous individual effort by striker Jade Crofts which needs to be watched on the video to appreciate its quality. Keeper Amie Preston's clearance skidded off the head of a Wrexham player into the path of Jade. With her back to two defenders, Jade dummied and let the ball run between the flat-footed pair. She skipped between them and raced in on goal to shoot. Wrexham skipper and keeper Delyth Morgan stood her ground and blocked the shot but Jade kept her cool and stroked the rebound left-footed into the net for the 15th minute equaliser.





















In the 2nd half Wrexham played some delightful football going forwards and scored 3 more goals against the tiring home side. They were denied more goals by 3 great saves by Amie Preston, one of which was of Gordon Banks proportions – a diving save to her left palming a point blank shot onto the post which was then cleared by a Celtic boot.

Amie joined Celtic this season from Kidderminster Harriers after previously playing at Stourbridge Ladies where she won the West Midlands League and the National League Midlands Division 1 golden gloves awards in successive seasons. The attendance of 201 was a Celtic Women's record.
