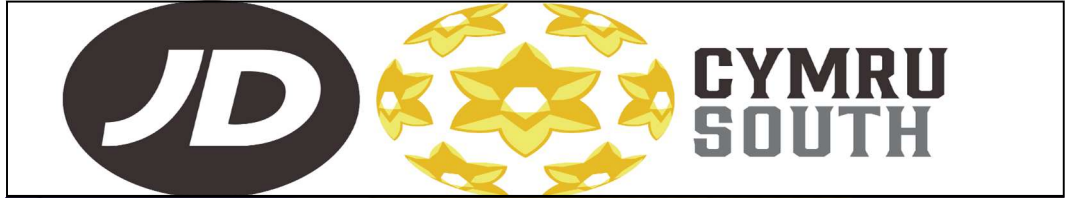

They were relegated to division 3 the following season but regained a place in division 2 in 2019/20. When the leagues were re-organised in 2021/22 they were in Ardal League South-East and last season they finished 2nd to gain promotion into Cymru South.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC WOMEN 6 - 1 CALDICOT TOWN (15-Dec)

Cwmbran Celtic have finished 2024 at the top of the South Wales League Division 1 following their pre-Christmas 6-1 defeat of Caldicot. Celtic opened their account on 5 minutes with a near post header by Lauren Boyd to meet a pinpoint corner by Katie Williams. Celtic's next two goals were both gems within 2 minutes by Jade Crofts. Firstly she fastened onto a through ball by Georgia Shwartz and out-manoeuvred 3 defenders to score. Next she took a short pass from Boyd and weaved her way past 3 defenders to steer the ball wide of the keeper. Celtic went 4-0 ahead, Lauren Boyd scoring a penalty after a handball. Caldicot reduced the arrears through a goal by Meyrick.

In the 2nd half Celtic wrapped the game up with 2 late goals. In the 86th minute, from a short corner, Summer Bowen-Quirk crossed for Eloise Meaney to head home. On 90+3 minutes Boyd's corner fell to Crofts at the far post who picked her spot to drill the ball into the net for her 5th career Celtic hat-trick.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024 (continued)

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwiweiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In the past two seasons Celtic have finished creditable 8th and 9th place in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 4 - 6 TRETHOMAS BLUEBIRDS (30-Nov)

With 90 minutes on the clock and Cwmbrian Celtic 6-1 down to high-spending league leaders Trethomas Bluebirds, a catastrophic end-result was on the cards for the home side. However, in the 13 minutes of time added on they found the net 3 times to at least salvage some pride in pulling the final score back to 6-4.

The game started so brightly for Celtic when, from an Isaac Powell free kick, Alfie Jones rugby tackled Callum Hodges to the floor in the penalty box, skipper Andrew Larcombe sending the keeper the wrong way with his spot kick. In the 26th minute Celtic gifted the visitors the equaliser by allowing Tedstone to stride through the middle and head keeper Irving's long clearance past the outrushing Pring into the empty net. Six minutes later Trethomas were in front when, from another long ball into the box, this time by Alfie Jones, Huggins outbattled three Celtic defenders to stab the ball into the net. Again, poor defending by Celtic. On the stroke of half time Trethomas were awarded a penalty when Pring brought down the attacker. Pring dived to his left to save Huggins's penalty but the rebound fell kindly to Huggins to score.

After the break Trethomas added two more goals with some delightful approach play. Both were set up by runs down the left bye-line. Leon Thomas converting the lay-back by Edwards and Huggins completing his hat-trick from close range. Trethomas were now running the Celtic defence ragged and added the 6th goal when Huggins turned provider for Tedstone to score in the 80th minute. Then came Celtic's late fight-back. On the stroke of 90 minutes, Alex McDowell crossed from the right, the ball fell to Dominic Connor on the opposite flank whose cross back into the box where Callum Hodges out-jumped Irving to head home at the far post. Then came an astonishing goal by Oliver Berry who thumped the ball from the right touchline just inside the opponent's half and watched it sail high and handsome over the keeper into the net. Celtic's fourth goal came from Larcombe whose header from a cross from the left bounced off the inside of the post to Irving who appeared to fumble the ball over the line. However, the goal was credited to Larcombe. Celtic are now bottom of the table at the halfway stage with a mountain to climb if they are to stay up.

CWMBRAN CELTIC WOMEN REVIEW OF 2024

Cwmbran Celtic Women ended a highly successful 2024 in first place at the halfway stage of the Adran League South. This was after they finished 3rd in the 2023/24 league. In the South Wales FA cup they surrendered the trophy they won the previous season by an agonising loss to Cascade YC on penalties in the quarter final after conceding an equaliser in the 5th minute of time added on in normal time. Their only league defeat in 2024 in last season's campaign was a narrow 2-1 defeat against champions Briton Ferry – a great performance considering they lost 6-0 and 10-0 earlier in the season. Captain Elosie Meaney and striker Jade Crofts were chosen for the League Team of the Season.

For the 2024/25 season manager James Kinsella recruited goalkeeper Amie Preston from Kidderminster Harriers, midfielder Katie Williams from Pontypridd and Lauren Boyd returned after several years away at Abergavenny and Cascade and what a difference all three made to the Celtic squad. Amie showed her class in the Adran Trophy against Premier League Wrexham with three fabulous saves including one which I described in my match report as matching Gordon Banks's save against Brazil in the 1970 World Cup. Katie fitted seamlessly into centre midfield and currently has the most assists (5) in the league. Lauren has been sublime on the left flank scoring 11 goals in 11 games.



A new recruit in January was Summer Bowen-Quirk from Cardiff City U19s. She played in all 18 games during 2024 showing her versatility whether at right back or right midfield. A big plus has been the ability to field a settled side week in week out. Centre backs Talia Shwartz and Elena Scrivens form a solid centre back pairing, Amy Roderick at full back was picked by James Kinsella as his player of last season. Sian Anthony and Keeley Perkins provide capable cover in defence. On the right flank Cerys Shipley was ever-present scoring 4 goals.

Celtic's three longest-serving players, Jodie Challenger, Eloise Meaney and Fiona Anthony along with Georgia Shwartz and Katie Williams form a power-house midfield ensuring that forward players Lauren Boyd and striker Jade Crofts have plenty of chances to show their goalscoring prowess. Jade shows uncanny awareness in front of goal. Her positioning and her skilful close ball control contributed in no small measure to her ending the year as top Adran goalscorer with 24 goals in League, Trophy and Welsh cup games. Lauren Boyd was 2nd with 16 goals which included 5 for Cascade last season.





















Celtic and Pontypridd are currently leading the chase for the league title. They have played two fantastic games so far, Celtic winning 5-4 in the Adran Trophy, and Pontypridd winning 4-3 in the league.



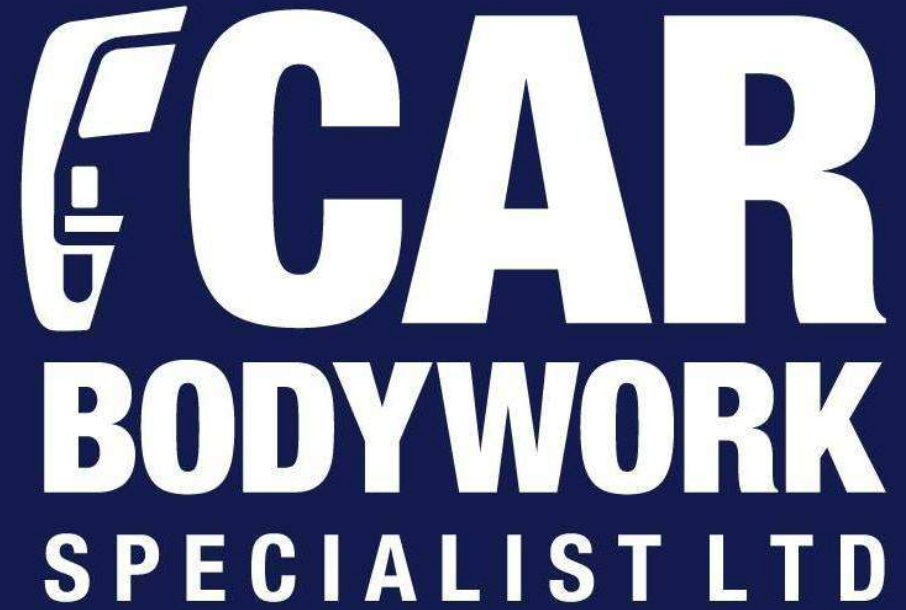

Josh Winstone: centre back, age 21. Formerly with Torfaen, Celtic & Merthyr Academy, Panteg, Ynysddu Welfare. Joined this season from Abergavenny Town. Also plays outfield. Debut: Carmarthen Town Oct 22.

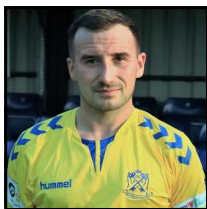

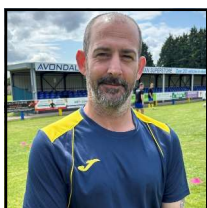

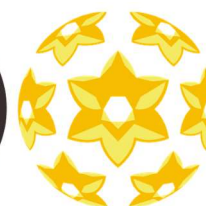
